Louisville, KY (April 22, 2022) — Atria Senior Living residents and staff in 45 states across the U.S. are planting more than 2,000 trees to celebrate Earth Day on April 22. Older adults and staff at Atria are setting an example in green practices and in being good stewards for future generations by planting trees on community grounds that their grandchildren and great-grandchildren may be able to enjoy just as much as they are. The tree saplings are provided by the Arbor Day Foundation and are indigenous to the local region.

“We must care for the resources the earth gives us so we can enjoy wildlife and nature today and decades from now. I hope younger generations also make preserving our planet and its resources a priority,” said Judith Siegel, a resident at Atria Woodbriar in Falmouth, Massachusetts.

At its Louisville, Kentucky-based Support Center, Atria employee volunteers will do landscaping and other upkeep on a “[Dreams With Wings](#)” residence in the Klondike neighborhood of Louisville. Dreams With Wings is a nonprofit helping empower individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and autism.

“We make it a priority to be good neighbors and conscientious stewards of natural resources because it’s the responsible and right thing to do. Our Support Center is planting trees in solidarity with our communities across the U.S. and the city of Louisville, where many of our employees call home,” said Ryan Sprau, Executive Vice President of Community Operations at Atria. “We invest in sustainable practices because of the grandchildren and the great-great grandchildren of the 43,000 seniors who call Atria home.”

Atria communities have also earned national designations for green design and energy efficiency. 14 Atria communities have earned or are seeking LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification, based on criteria from the U.S. Green Building Council®. LEED is the internationally accepted standard for verifying a building is designed, constructed and operated to improve performance in areas such as sustainability, innovation, and indoor environmental quality.

In addition, 61 Atria communities earned the 2021 ENERGY STAR Certification, a recognition for superior energy performance among the top 25 percent of similar buildings nationwide this past year.
